### A Word from our President

This past summer, when I was trying to convince my wife that I "needed" a lathe, I showed her a copy of an old Shopsmith ad that read "Woodworking-It's the *unselfish* hobby." Lisa quickly saw through my ruse (she's good at that), but ultimately acquiesced—with one condition: I had to make all of the Christmas gifts that year.

Several bowls, pens, egg-o-scopes, tool handles, and bottle stoppers later, I find myself reflecting on that Shopsmith ad. Woodturning has been a great hobby so far. It's introduced me to dozens of new friends, provided me with hours of entertainment, and has allowed me to surprise friends and family with hand crafted gifts. While pleasing family and friends has been



its own reward, I am delighted to find opportunities to use woodturning to help others.

For example, this past fall, Seattle's Woodcraft store hosted pen-turning events for Breast Cancer Awareness month and the Pens for Troops programs. There's no need to travel all the way to Seattle, however, if you too are interested in helping others by woodturning. Our very own John Elliot coordinates our club's Pens for the Troops program.

A couple other opportunities have come to my attention recently:

- The Peninsula Unitarian Universalist Fellowship has been coordinating with the Gig Harbor Potters Guild on a fund-raising project called "Empty Bowls" for local food-banks. Last year, they sold 200 bowls (filled with strawberry shortcake) and raised over \$1,200 for the South Kitsap Helpline food bank. They are interested in collaborating with us this year to put on a similar fund-raiser.
- 2) The Big Brother, Big Sister of the Alleghenies program coordinates with local woodturners and woodworkers to raise money for their program through a website called Turning For Charity http://www.turningforcharity.org/

As a teacher and a father with three young kids in childcare, I can personally attest that local youth support groups are in need of contributions from the community. The program my kids attend, The Boys and Girls Club of Bainbridge Island, has had to raise their tuition from \$40 a month in 2007 to a nearly unsubsidized \$250 a month in 2012. Unfortunately the families who need these services the most are often the ones most hard pressed to afford them.




