Stay tuned for information on a possible day or two of "Beyond ABC" (anchor, bevel, cut) worlshop in March (26, 27) in conjunction with our monthly presentation. Ed Pretty is the demonstrator and explains how the body is used for both anchoring and tool control (and actually to prevent catches). He also explains the distinct differences in jobs between the forward and back hands in turning and when to engage the tool rest with your hand (or not). 
