"My primary influences come from the energy and beauty of Native American ceramics, the architecture of the American Southwest with its textures, tones and monumentality, and the natural beauty of the material of wood – what I refer to as the most perfectly imperfect material to work with.

My intent is to capture the simplicity of form, the complexity of surface, and the energy of the interior that is contained by the thin membrane of the wood that defines it. In this regard, it would be fair to call me a wooden potter."

#### **About David Ellsworth**

David is the founding member of AAW, of which he was president from 1986-1991, and its first Honorary Lifetime Member. He has written over fifty articles on subjects related to craft and woodturning and has operated the Ellsworth School of Woodturning at his home and studio in Buck's County, Pennsylvania since 1990. His works have been included in the permanent collections of forty-three museums, including the Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York, the Philadelphia Museum of Art, the Los Angeles County Museum of Art, and the Museum of Fine Arts in Boston. He has taught workshops throughout the world and has received fellowship grants from the National Endowment of Arts, the Pennsylvania Council for the Arts, and the PEW Foundation. In 2009 he was elected the "Master of the Medium" by the James A. Renwick Alliance of the Smithsonian Institution in Washington, D.C. He is a Honorary Lifetime Member of the Collectors of Wood Art, and a Fellow and a former Trustee of the American Craft Council.



### **Back Copies of Chattermarks are Just a Click Away**

There's a wealth of information about our club and many resources that can improve your woodturning skills at OPCAAW.com. But it's often not the first place you look for that information.

Every month, our club sends an email blast to more than 400 people who have asked to subscribe to our monthly Chattermarks newsletter.

When I joined OPCAAW in 2013, Chattermarks was being emailed as a PDF attachment to a number of members, but also printed out and distributed at our monthly meetings and being sent through the U.S. Postal Service to a group of members who did not have email addresses.

Gradually over the years more and more of our members have become computer literate or are accessing the internet and email through their smart phones and other devices. We no longer print copies of Chattermarks for handout at meetings; and we no longer send any copies by mail as the number who requested to receive it that way have faded away.

And, in fact, we no longer attach a copy of the newsletter to our email messages announcing that the new issue of Chattermarks is available; instead, we simply point to a place on our website where each new issue of Chattermarks will be live for the foreseeable future.

Our newsletters have a website section of their own, with a separate link on the menu bar that takes you directly to our newsletter archive.

Because PDFs of newsletters going back several years were available to me when I became OPCAAW webmaster in 2017, I was able to archive and organize them on our WordPress website. When you click on the menu link to "Newsletters" you will be taken to a page where you can see links to newsletters as far back as 2009.

The newsletters from past years are displayed in a grid by year and by month. In some instances, no newsletter was created. In that case, the fact there is no Chattermarks is noted. Otherwise, if you click on the three-letter designation for each month, you can view that month's newsletter.

The most recent year is at the top of the grid, and the link to the most recent month's newsletter is always in bold type. This arrangement makes it easy to find the most recent issue of Chattermarks.

Chattermarks is created each month by our Vice President for Public Relations, currently Tim Larson.

Chattermarks typically devotes its front page to photos and a description of the demonstrator scheduled for the month's meeting. Another standard feature is the President's Corner on Page 2, in which the club president shares news and information about the club and what's coming up. The rest of each issue features are variety of articles submitted by members or reprinted from AAW sources plus some standard content, such as upcoming events, contact information for the officers and board members, information about our mentor program and about our sponsors.

Member submissions are always welcomed and help create a more varied and interesting newsletter.

Normally, the newsletter is completed and published about a week before our meeting, but we try always to get it published no later than the weekend before the meeting.

As soon as the newsletter is finalized, a PDF is uploaded to our website and a link to that online file is generated. The link is then distributed to all who have subscribed to our email list.

At the same time, the Newsletter page on the website is updated with the new issue. And an image of the front page of the issue is uploaded for use in the right-hand column of nearly every website page. That image, under the heading "Latest Newsletter," serves as a link to the PDF file.

As a result, the latest newsletter is accessible from any page of our website that has a right-hand column as part of its design.

I know that we all have demands on our time, but sometime when you are not too busy and


