
Embellish Your Turnings with Brad Stave

Several years ago, when my nephew Hyrum was living in our home, he had received a hundred bucks from a birthday gift and wanted to buy a lathe with me for my pathetic wood shop, so he could play around with it. I said yes, and several thousand dollars later, we were all set up...:) I started with simple bowls and small vessels and quickly became interested in resin and its possibilities. I have developed slowly over the last year or so a technique where I can achieve almost perfectly clear resin using a combination of deep pour Fathom resin from TotalBoat.com, a vacuum chamber treatment followed by curing in a pressure pot for several days at a low temperature. This process has allowed me to create pretty much whatever design I can dream up without the worry of cracking, bubbling etc. I love creating resin/wood creations often with windows cut or carved to showcase different subjects or patterns.





I have been using my hobby to raise money for Operation Underground Railroad by way of a website: <u>ArtForOUR.org</u> and my YouTube channel (<u>https://www.youtube.com/c/artforour</u>). A little note on the plan for 2023 classes.

Before we can get started, we need to update and maintain the lathes and purchase some new equipment. We need to get all the instructors together to discuss the scheduling of those classes. We must contact school to schedule room for classes and see if rental price has increased.

The current plan is to hold some of the classes that we did last years and add more. Possible classes that will be offered:

- Pen Turning
- Tool making: point tool, awl, elf texturing tool
- Coloring (dye and paint)
- Goblets
- Sphere turning
- Bowl turning
- Small winged bowls (skilled turners)
- Natural edge bowls
- Bottle stopper and mandrel
- Hollow forms
- Skew and basic tool use
- Box making
- Ways of holding item on lathe for turning
- Tool handles
- Small platter or plate (may include coloring rim)
- Xmas ornaments (sphere, bird house and snowmen)
- Thread chasing for wood (if I can beg, borrow, or steal enough thread tools)

The first class probably won't be before March unless everything falls in place correctly. We will also need a list of helpers to assist the instructors, consisting of helping to setup and teardown, providing assistance to students when needed, helping to change chuck jaws, tools and as safety watch.






